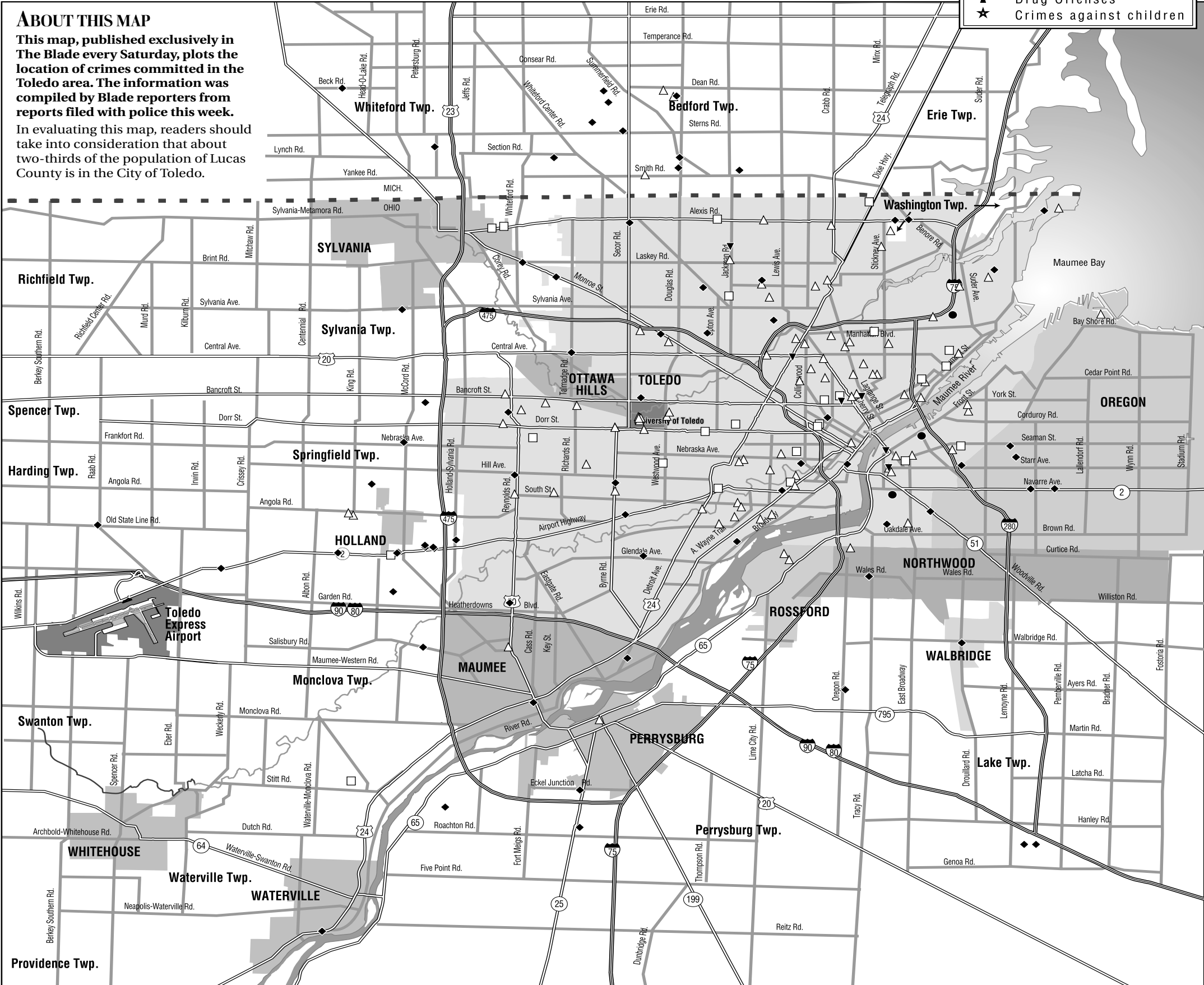

Tips needed on man who exposed himself

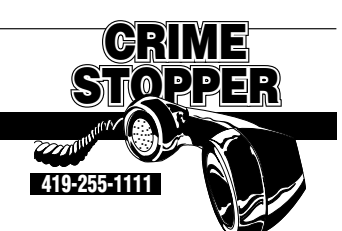
Toledo police are seeking information through the Crime Stopper program about a man they believe exposed himself three times in West Toledo and then drove off in a car.

The most recent incident happened Wednesday in Pine Glen Park at Rohr and Wynnewood drives. A 36-year-old woman was walking about 3:30 p.m. when a man approached her, pulled down his shorts, grabbed her, and rubbed his body against her. He got into his car and fled, police said.

Three days earlier, a man got out of his car, lowered his shorts, and exposed himself to a 33-year-old woman in a parking lot at 3057 West Alexis Rd. He got into his car and drove off after the incident about 5 p.m.

The woman told police the man also exposed himself in the parking lot about 8 p.m. Feb. 1. Police said several females saw the man expose himself during the recent incident.

The man is described as white, in his 30s or 40s, 5 feet, 9 inches to 5 feet, 11 inches tall, with a



heavy build, and balding. In the park, he was wearing blue gym shorts and a gray shirt. He wore a blue, hooded sweatshirt and boxer shorts in the parking lot. He was driving a tan or cream-colored, midsize car believed to be a Ford Taurus.

Anyone with information about the incidents is asked to call the Crime Stopper program. Callers may remain anonymous and may be eligible for a cash reward.

Detectives seek help to solve 5 burglaries in Bedford Twp.

TEMPERANCE — The typically sleepy community of Bedford Township was hit with a crime wave Wednesday morning, and Monroe County sheriff's detectives seek help.

Five homes were burglarized between 1 a.m. and 3 a.m. while residents were at home sleeping, sheriff's Detective Tom Redmond said.

The burglaries occurred at the homes of Edward Bankowski, 1621 West Erie Rd., Temperance; Laurell Geis, 1617 West Temperance Rd.; Tom Oley, 2654 Chapel Creek Drive, Lambertville; Anne Pippin, 8142 Brians Court, Temperance, and Richard Weber, 2110 Fountain Circle, Lambertville.

A woman on West Erie

reported seeing a light gray van, possibly a Dodge, in her neighbor's driveway at the time her neighbor's home was being burglarized, Detective Redmond said.

Three different sets of footprints were found in the mud outside another residence, "making us think it is at least three different people involved," Detective Redmond said.

He said a stolen credit card taken in one of the burglaries was used at a Meijer store in Maumee at 5 a.m. Wednesday and the video footage shows one of the suspects to be a young, black male.

Laptops, cell phones, a digital camera, a digital camcorder, credit cards, a wallet,

a power-paint spray gun, personal papers, keys, garage door openers, and a wireless door bell were among the items reported missing. Detective Redmond said people have received a few calls from some of the stolen cell phones and that detectives are pursuing those leads.

Eight cars also were burglarized last week, but Detective Redmond said he believes only some of the car break-ins were related to the five home burglaries. He said he is working with Toledo police to identify possible suspects.

Traffic on stretch of I-75, Talmadge-Sylvania corner to get extra scrutiny

The intersection of Sylvania Avenue and Talmadge Road and I-75 between Alexis Road and I-475 will be the focuses of the special traffic enforcement program through March 25.

Officers will crack down on speeding and other violations in those areas. The officers' overtime is covered through \$67,188

in state and federal grants. The money will also help pay for extra police patrols throughout the city during the St. Patrick's Day weekend.
