

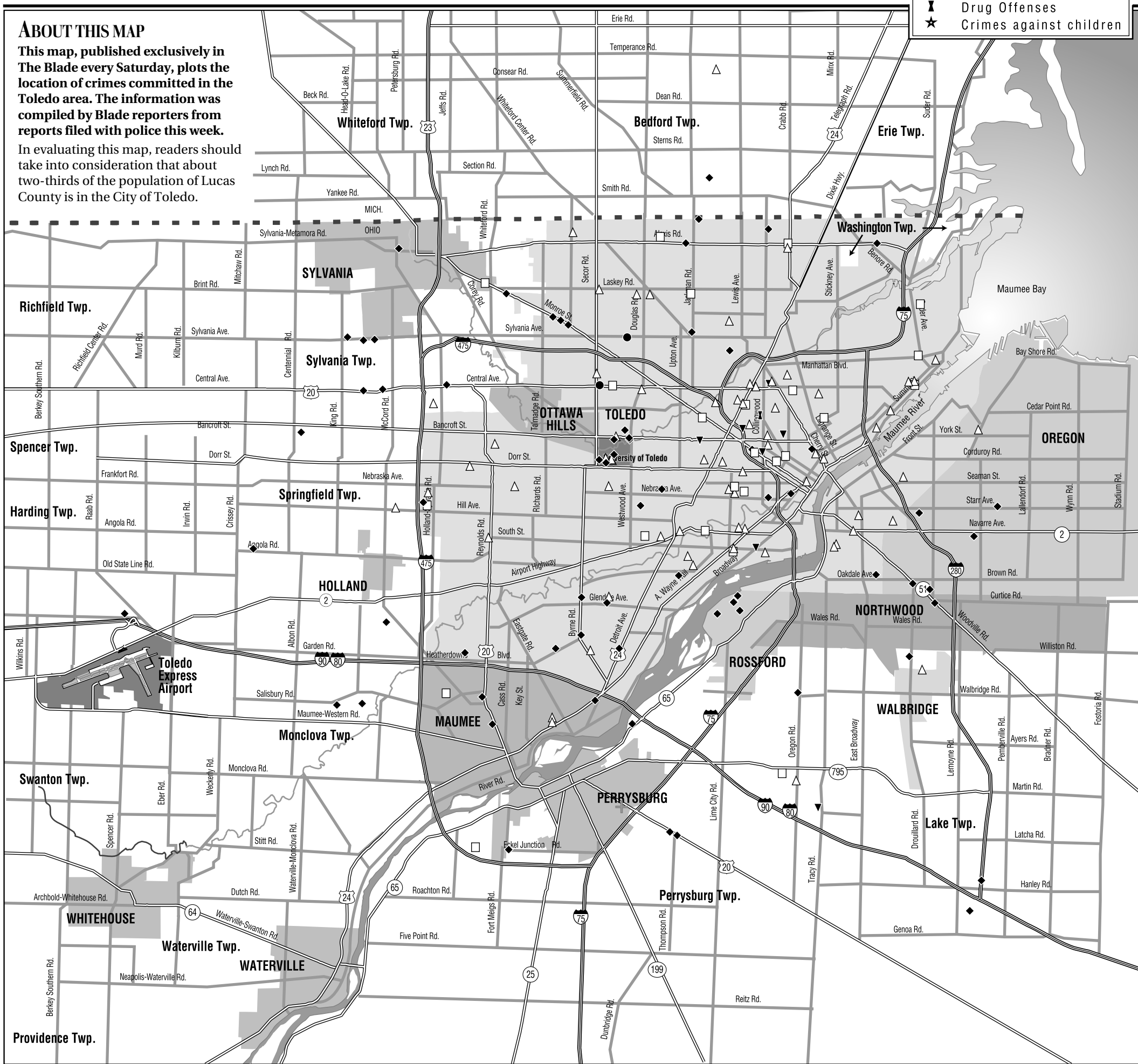
Crime Watch

Burglary victims seek return of family videos

Toledo police are seeking information through the Crime Stopper program about a burglary last month in the south end during which a Sony camcorder and 20 videotapes of family activities were stolen.

The items were taken from a house at 5114 South Ave. between 3 p.m. Feb. 6 and 3 p.m. Feb. 7.

The burglar or burglars tried to kick in a door, but were un-

successful. Entry was made through a rear basement window, and the house was ransacked. Exit was through a rear bathroom window, police said.

The videotapes were of the victim's son, who died in June, 2005, and his children.

The camera bag was black and looked like leather with a handle on top.

Other items taken included a computer, printer, keyboard,



and jewelry.

The victims are most interested in having the videotapes returned, police said.

Anyone with information is asked to call the Crime Stopper program. Callers may remain anonymous and may be eligible for a cash reward.

calf are both charged with one count each of the same three crimes.

Four counts of each of the same three charges were also filed against the business, Yum-

mies Inc.

"These food-stamp benefits are for children," said Earl Mack, agent-in-charge of the Toledo District of the Ohio Department of Public Safety.

"Your tax dollars are supposed to pay for feeding children, not going into someone's pocket," Mr. Mack said.

Mr. Mack said that part of

the scheme included swiping a food-stamp card for a particular amount and then giving the person a lower amount in cash.

Mr. Dann said that several other businesses in Toledo were being investigated, as well as 50 or so customers who participated as "co-conspirators" in the alleged Yummies fraud.

Patrols will focus on Dorr-Douglas intersection, I-75
